

The Haryana Government has decided to conduct energy audit large govt. buildings to optimize the energy consumption level. The objective of the energy audit to minimize the energy cost and to plug the energy gap. In Haryana, the energy audit of ten govt. buildings including Haryana Raj Bhawan has been completed and the recommendations of CFLs & T-5, 28 watt tube lights made by the energy audit company have also been implemented in these buildings. Haryana Raj Bhawan is the first building in Haryana where energy audit recommendations have been implemented comprehensively.

Energy audit of New Haryana Civil Secretariat Sector-17, Chandigarh has been completed by National Productivity Council, New-Delhi and the energy audit of another 20 large govt. buildings has been undertaken by HAREDA during 2008-09 with the financial assistance of Bureau of Energy Efficiency, Govt. of India.
